#### Questions for Discussion, Part 1:

- 1. Do you experience the trends that Barna and Packard describe in your community the Nones and the Dones?
- 2. To what extent is the critique of the dechurched fair? Unfair?
- 3. Talk about the interplay of belonging, believing and behaving. How does your church understand the relationship of believing and behaving to belonging?

## Four Strategies for Developing a Relevant Witness:

- 1. Invite Participation...with limits
- 2. Undermine Bureaucracy
- 3. Be truly relational
- 4. Impact your community...and be impacted

#### Ouestions for Discussion, Part 2

- 1. What would it look like for your church to reallocate 20% of your resources (budget, staff, and facility) for innovation?
- 2. If you did an audit of the resources committed to preparing a single worship service in your congregation, what would it show?
- 3. In what ways can your church decrease judgment, foster belonging, and increase engagement with your neighborhood?
- 4. How might your congregation become a center that nurtures meaningful, soul searching conversations in your context?
