Resources for Conscientious Objection

As a historic peace church, Mennonites have a long tradition of [conscientious objection](#) to military service. Before World War II, leaders of peace churches secured legal exemption from military service for anyone who, by reason of religious training and belief is conscientiously opposed to participation in war in any form. This is the legal definition as recognized by the Selective Service. Mennonite youth should think through their own convictions and prepare a [“CO File,”](#) a collection of evidence that, in the event of a draft, would demonstrate that their beliefs are sincere and long-held.
