Finance Update

In November, Central Plains' budget fell below the break-even line for the fourth straight month. Income for the month was at \$34,185.70. Expenses for the month came in at \$36,207.27, generating a small deficit of \$2,021.57 for the month. This result increases the overall deficit for the fiscal year to \$55,938. December is usually a very good month to help us lower the deficit and we would ask that you prayerfully consider your support during this time so we can start to reverse this trend! Church workshop blends relational healing with spiritual formation

How are your church members dealing with past relational hurts that don't seem to fully heal? Ted Lewis of Duluth, Minnesota, now features the Hagar Workshop which is designed for Christians who want to find new perspectives and skills for coping with interpersonal hurts and regrets. Ideal for a full Saturday with lunchtime, this workshop does not aim to address corporate conflicts within the church, but rather addresses the individual's own journey with past wounds. Even so, the topics lay good groundwork for helping congregants to become more comfortable with corporate practices of apology, trust-building, and reconciliation.

As a mediator and trainer, Ted Lewis also provides other services for churches that want to address issues of conflict and communication in both prevention and intervention capacities.
